- 5. A little information on Rotary and their effort to eradicate Polio..

 Rotary International, the World Health Organization, UNICEF, and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention launched the Global Polio Eradication Initiative in 1988. Since then, ending polio has been Rotary's top priority. The number of polio cases has been slashed by more than 99 percent, preventing five million cases of childhood paralysis and 250,000 deaths.

The wild poliovirus remains endemic in just three countries: Afghanistan, Pakistan and Nigeria. However, the final 1 percent of cases are the most difficult and expensive to prevent, which is why support for Rotary's challenge is crucial to the initiative's success. It only costs 45 cents to immunize 1 child. Bring your change Gurrie, and let's make a difference.
