Happy Spring!

As we come to the conclusion of another winter, I am looking forward to longer and warmer days ahead. This time of year also signals that we are moving closer to the end of another school year. It is hard to believe that we have completed more than two-thirds of the school year.

When we return from Spring Break, time typically moves very quickly through the remainder of the third trimester. We have many sports that run during the spring including soccer, boys' volleyball, and girls' softball. Between the three sports, we could have more than a third of our students involved in those activities. In addition, we have the spring musical in May, Fortnightly, continuing service activities, band-choir-orchestra concerts, and many other activities. 8th grade parents will begin to receive information about graduation activities and all of you will receive end of year information. We will continue to utilize the Tiger Tracks, weekly emails, and the website as our main communication tools.

In April, students will take the PARCC (Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers) assessment. This will be the third year students have taken the PARCC assessment. Students are taking six assessments over the course of six days. There are three tests for reading/language arts and three for math. Testing will take place on April 4th, 5th, and 6th in reading/language arts and for math on April 10th, 11th, and 12th.

A reminder to eighth grade families that our graduation ceremony is held at Lyons Township High School (South Campus) in the Field House. Our ceremony begins at 7:00pm on Tuesday, May 29th. Because of the size of the facility we do not need to provide tickets. We will be providing more details in the coming weeks that detail ceremony information, including requests for handicap seating.
