Greetings from Gurrie!

As we conclude another winter, I am looking forward to longer and warmer days ahead. This time of year also signals that we are moving closer to the end of another school year. It is hard to believe that we have completed more than two-thirds of the year.

When we return from Spring Break, time typically moves very quickly through the remainder of the third trimester. We have many sports that run during the spring including soccer, boys volleyball, and girls softball. Between the three sports, we could have more than a third of our students involved in those activities.

In addition, we have continuing service activities, band-choir-orchestra concerts, and many other activities.

8th grade parents will continue to receive information about graduation activities and all of you will receive end of year information. We will continue to utilize the Tiger Tracks, Parent Square, and the website as our main communication tools.

In April, students will take the IAR (Illinois Assessment of Readiness) assessment. Students are taking six assessments over the course of six days. There are three tests for reading/language arts and three for math. The math assessment (60 minutes each) will take place on April 11, 12, and 13. The English/Language Arts assessment (90 minutes each) will take place on April 14, 19, and 20.

A reminder to eighth grade families that this year, our graduation ceremony will be held here at Gurrie in the field behind the school. Our ceremony begins at 5:30pm on Tuesday, May 31. We will be providing more details in the coming weeks that detail ceremony information.

I would also like to congratulate Zoe Connelly for her first ILGWA state tournament appearance on Sunday at Oswego High School. The teamwork, comradery, and empathy you all displayed this past weekend has made me beyond proud to coach at Gurrie. Thank you all for the memories, Coach Varela.

Now I would like to recognize your peer, an eighth grader from Countryside, IL. He competed at the 85 pound weight class in the single A division. This wrestler started his tournament with a 6-1 victory in the preliminary round and a nail-biter 2-1 victory in the quarterfinal. It was this path that led him to the semi-final round and automatically earned a spot on the podium along with an IESA All-State title. After losing in the semis and a Sudden Victory 2-0 decision in the consolation semi finals, we have the fourth wrestler in Gurrie wrestling's program history that has walked away with some hardware!!!
