District 105 Speech Team

On Saturday, February 25th, the District 105 Speech Team competed in the West 40 Speech and Drama Festival. After months of practice, the team put on a series of incredible performances, with all participants earning individual 1st or 2nd place scoring finishes. The team brought back a 3rd place overall trophy against some truly tough competition, and they had the best total score D105 has seen in close to a decade.

Paula Calderon had the overall best individual performance score for Gurrie with her serious monologue, followed closely behind by Brandon Harris' humorous monologue, Mary Sandman's serious presentation, and the humorous trio of Elena Bailey, Maddie Shishman, and Abbie Scouffas. The other first-place finishers included the group dramatic presentation from Lola Babinski, Mireya Brkic, Payton Meller, and Beckett Michel; the humorous duet of Eleanor Harmount and Louise Kallemeyn; and the serious duet of Taylor Hoffenberg and Mila Panos. The scoring for D105 was rounded out by tremendous performances from Caroline Mshar and her original slam poem; Kevin Seiple in the humorous poetry category; Zoe Stone and Nolan Fey in the extemporaneous duet category; and Gianna Flores in the oratorical declamation category.

Greetings from Gurrie!

As we conclude another winter, I am looking forward to longer and warmer days ahead. This time of year also signals that we are moving closer to the end of another school year. It is hard to believe that we have completed more than two-thirds of the year.

When we return from Spring Break, time typically moves very quickly through the remainder of the third trimester. We have many sports that run during the spring including soccer, boys volleyball, and girls softball. Between the three sports, we could have more than a third of our students involved in those activities.

In addition, we have continuing service activities, band-choir-orchestra concerts, and many other activities.

8th grade parents will continue to receive information about graduation activities and all of you will receive end of year information. We will continue to utilize the Tiger Tracks, Parent Square, and the website as our main communication tools.

In April, students will take the IAR (Illinois Assessment of Readiness) assessment. Students are taking five assessments over the course of four days. There are two tests for reading/language arts and three for math. The math assessment (60 minutes each) will take place on April 11 and 12. The English/Language Arts assessment (90 minutes each) will take place on April 13 and 14.
