Dear Parent or Guardian:

The adolescent years are marked by a roller-coaster ride of emotions – difficult for students, their parents and educators. It is easy to misinterpret depression as “normal” adolescent moodiness; however, depression (among the most common of mental illnesses) appears to be occurring at a much earlier age. Depression – which is treatable – is a leading risk factor for suicide. In addition, self-injury has become a growing problem among youth.

To proactively address these issues, Gurrie Middle School is offering depression awareness and suicide prevention training as part of the Signs of Suicide (SOS) program. The program aims to increase help-seeking behaviors among students concerned about themselves or a friend. Listed on SAMHSA’s National Registry of Evidence-Based Programs and Practices, the SOS program showed a reduction in self-reported suicide attempts by 40-64% in randomized control studies (Aseltine et al., 2007 & Schilling et al., 2016). The SOS program is presented to us through Elyssa’s Mission, a nonprofit organization dedicated to suicide prevention.

As part of the program, school staff will show the SOS Program video and subsequently lead students in discussion. Students will then complete a brief depression screener as well as fill out a Response Card indicating whether or not they would like to speak to an adult at the school regarding concerns about themselves or a friend. The depression screening tool addresses thoughts and feelings which a parent may be unaware their child is having. This tool does not provide a diagnosis of depression, but rather alerts school staff to those students requiring further investigation. Our school social worker and psychologist as well as qualified staff from a community partner will be available to meet with designated students; school staff will subsequently notify parents/guardians regarding any needed next steps.

Our goals in participating in this program are straightforward:

- To help our students understand that depression is a treatable illness
- To explain that suicide is a preventable tragedy that often occurs as a result of untreated depression
- To provide students with the training on how to identify serious depression and potential suicidality in themselves or a friend
- To impress upon youth that they can help themselves or a friend by taking the simple step of talking to a responsible adult about their concerns

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- To help students know whom in the school they can turn to for help, if they need it

Students at Gurrie Middle School will participate in a single lesson utilizing this curriculum during the school day. Seventh grade students will participate on November 6th and eighth grade students will participate on November 9th. We hope all parents will partner with us to educate our students, but you do have the right to refuse participation. Please check whether or not you would like your child to participate in this program below and return this letter to your child's advisory teacher no later than Monday, October 30th.

Queridos Padres o Guardián:

Los años de la adolescencia están marcados por una montaña rusa de emociones, difícil para los estudiantes, sus padres y educadores. Es fácil malinterpretar la depresión como mal humor adolescente "normal"; sin embargo, la depresión (entre las enfermedades mentales más comunes) parece estar ocurriendo a una edad mucho más temprana. La depresión, que es tratable, es un factor de riesgo principal para el suicidio. Además, las autolesiones se han convertido en un problema creciente entre los jóvenes.

Para abordar proactivamente estos problemas, La Escuela Intermedia Gurrie está ofreciendo concientización sobre la depresión y capacitación en prevención del suicidio como parte del programa Señales de Suicidio (SOS). El programa tiene como objetivo aumentar los comportamientos de búsqueda de ayuda entre los estudiantes preocupados por sí mismos o por un amigo. Incluido en el Registro Nacional de Programas y Prácticas Basados en la Evidencia de SAMHSA, el programa SOS mostró una reducción en los intentos de suicidio auto reportados en un 40-64% en estudios de control aleatorios (Aseltine et al., 2007 & Schilling et al., 2016). El programa SOS se nos presenta a través de la Misión de Elyssa, una organización sin ánimo de lucro dedicada a la prevención del suicidio.

Como parte del programa, el personal de la escuela mostrarán el video del Programa SOS y, posteriormente, guiarán a los estudiantes en la discusión. Luego, los estudiantes completarán una breve prueba de detección de depresión, así como también llenarán una tarjeta de respuesta que indica si les gustaría o no hablar con un adulto en la escuela con respecto a las preocupaciones sobre sí mismos o un amigo. La herramienta de detección de depresión aborda los pensamientos y sentimientos que un padre puede no ser consciente de que su hijo está teniendo. Esta herramienta no proporciona un diagnóstico de depresión, sino que alerta al personal de la escuela sobre aquellos estudiantes que requieren más investigación. Nuestro trabajador social y psicólogo de la escuela, así como el personal calificado de un socio de la comunidad estarán disponibles para reunirse con los estudiantes designados; posteriormente, el personal de la escuela notificará a los padres / guardianes sobre los próximos pasos necesarios

Nuestros objetivos al participar en este programa son directos:

- Ayudar a nuestros estudiantes a comprender que la depresión es una enfermedad tratable
- Explicar que el suicidio es una tragedia prevenible que a menudo ocurre como resultado de la depresión no tratada
- Proporcionar a los estudiantes la capacitación sobre cómo identificar la depresión grave y el suicidio potencial en sí mismos o en un amigo

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- Enseñar a los jóvenes de que pueden ayudarse a sí mismos o a un amigo dando el simple paso de Hablar con un adulto responsable sobre sus preocupaciones
- Para ayudar a los estudiantes a saber a quién pueden acudir en la escuela en busca de ayuda, si la necesitan

Los estudiantes de la Escuela Intermedia Gurrie participarán en una sola lección utilizando este currículo durante el día escolar. Los estudiantes de séptimo grado participarán el 6 de noviembre y los estudiantes de octavo grado participarán el 9 de noviembre. Esperamos que todos los padres se asocien con nosotros para educar a nuestros estudiantes, pero usted tiene el derecho de rechazar la participación. Verifique si desea o no que su hijo participe en este programa abajo y devuelva esta carta al maestro asesor de su hijo a más tardar el lunes, 30 de octubre.

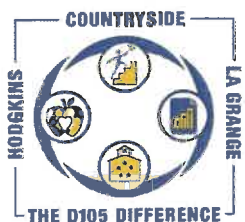

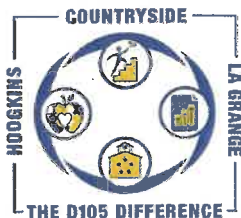

Class Descriptions



Homework Support:

A certified teacher is present at every session to assist students with homework or other academic needs they might have. When homework is completed, students can also engage in quiet activities such as writing greeting cards, cursive practice, coloring/drawing, and making origami. This is a quiet and calming space for students.

Open Gym:

Students and families will interact socially through open and guided gym activities. This allows families from across the district to connect and build relationships.

English as a Second Language for Adults:

One of our teachers will provide English language classes and the Rosetta Stone program will be used to teach English as a second language. During this time, you will develop your proficiency and self-assurance in the English language. There is also the option to learn Spanish!

Maker Space:

Students will be in a space to design, play, tinker, collaborate, inquire, problem-solve, and invent. Students get to use their construction, puzzle-solving, and motor skills to build and create structures. Scientific thinking and play come together for some hands-on activities.

Crafts:

Arts and crafts help build relationships among participants, creating an atmosphere of collaboration and acceptance.

Cooks Corner for K-2 (Tuesday) 3rd-8th (Thursday):

This class encourages creativity, and enhances students' understanding of math and science concepts through practical application and yummy treats with kid friendly recipes.

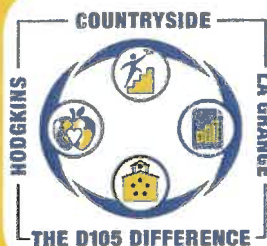

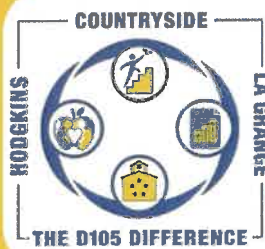
