Dear District 105 Parents and Guardians,

With winter weather upon us soon, I would like to provide an update about information concerning weather related school closings.

During emergency weather situations, I work closely with Lyons Township School Superintendents well before the start of the school day to monitor weather conditions and review other information provided by the police and bus companies. We generally make a decision together about whether or not to close the township schools unless there is a problem that affects only one particular district.

If District 105 schools are closed, radio & TV stations that broadcast school closings will be notified. These stations include: WGN, 720 AM; WBBM, 780 AM; CBS 2 TV; NBC 5 TV; ABC 7 TV; WGN 9 TV; FOX 32 TV; and CLTV. We also provide information through the following sources about District 105 school closings and other weather-related circumstances such as late buses:

- The district's website, www.d105.net, is your best source for timely information about whether our schools are closed or in session on days with emergency weather situations.
- Parents can also find any changes in our schedule by visiting www.emergencyclosingcenter.com.
- Please do not call your school or the district office about school closing information as our personnel will be very busy responding to the safety needs that arise during emergency weather.

In addition to providing information through the sources listed above, we will contact our parents/guardians about school closings and other weather-related circumstances with our automated message service. The service will make calls to cell and home phones and send email and text (for those who have "opted in") messages. **It is important that your home school has your correct phone numbers and email address on file in order to receive these or other important messages.** If you have changed your phone numbers or email addresses since registration without notifying your school, please email or send a note to your school office so that we can update your contact information. Finally, if you would like to receive text messages, but you have not yet "opted in," please send a text message of "Y" or "Yes" to our district's short code 67587.

We have a 10:00 A.M. LATE ARRIVAL option for all five schools as an alternative to cancelling school during severe weather conditions. We will notify our parents of LATE ARRIVAL in the same manner we use for the cancellation of school. Attached to this letter are LATE ARRIVAL bus stop times alongside our regular bus stop schedules for schools that provide bus service. The schedules can also be found under the PARENT/GUARDIAN tab of our District 105 and school websites.

Please be assured that the safety of our students is foremost in my mind when I make a decision with the township superintendents concerning the cancellation of school. Because individual circumstances vary, it is important to recognize that our parents have the primary right and responsibility to determine whether or not to send their children to school during emergency weather situations.

Estimados Padres y Tutores del Distrito 105,

Con el invierno en camino, me gustaria ponerlos al día con la información relacionada al cierre de las escuelas por causa del clima.

Durante situaciones de emergencia climática, yo trabajo junto con los Superintendentes de la Escuela Del Municipio de Lyons mucho antes que comienza el día escolar para observar las condiciones del clima y revisar otra información que recibimos de la policía y las compañías de los autobuses. Generalmente tomamos una decisión juntos acerca de si se cierran o no las escuelas del municipio a menos que ocurra un problema que afecten solamente a un distrito en particular.

Si las escuelas del Distrito 105 van a estar cerradas, las estaciones de radio y televisión que transmiten el cierre de las escuelas serán notificadas. Estas estaciones incluyen: WGN, 720 AM; WBBM, 780 AM; CBS 2 TV; NBC 5 TV; ABC 7 TV; WGN 9 TV; FOX 32 TV; y CLTV. También les damos información a través de las siguientes fuentes sobre el cierre de escuelas del Distrito 105 y otras circunstancias relacionadas con el clima, tales como el retraso de los autobuses:

- El sitio web del distrito, www.d105.net, es su mejor fuente de información oportuna sobre si nuestras escuelas están cerradas o en sesión en días con situaciones de clima de emergencia.
- Los padres también pueden encontrar cualquier cambio en nuestro horario visitando www.emergencyclosingcenter.com
- Por favor no llame a su escuela o a la oficina del distrito para obtener información sobre el cierre de la escuela ya que nuestro personal estará muy ocupado respondiendo a las necesidades de seguridad que surgen durante el clima de emergencia.

Además de darles información a través de las recursos mencionados anteriormente, nos comunicaremos con nuestros padres / tutores sobre el cierre de escuelas y otras circunstancias relacionadas con el clima con nuestro servicio de mensajes automatizados. El servicio hará llamadas a teléfonos celulares y domésticos y enviará correos electrónicos y mensajes de texto (para aquellos que hayan "optado"). Es importante que la escuela de su hijo/a tenga sus números de teléfonos correctos y la dirección de su correo electrónico correcto para poder recibir estos y otros mensajes importantes. Si ha cambiado los números de teléfonos o sus direcciones de correo electrónico desde el día de inscripción sin notificar a su escuela, por favor envíe un correo electrónico o envíe una nota a la oficina de su escuela para que podamos actualizar su información de contacto. Finalmente, si desea recibir mensajes de texto, pero aún no "optó por participar", envíe un mensaje de texto de "Y" o "YES" al código de acceso corto 67587 de nuestro distrito.

Tenemos una opción de LLEGADA TARDE a las 10:00 A.M. para las cinco escuelas como una alternativa a la cancelación de la escuela durante condiciones climáticas severas. Notificaremos a nuestros padres sobre la LLEGADA TARDE de la misma manera que usamos para la cancelación de la escuela. Junto con esta carta van los horarios de las paradas del autobús para las escuelas que ofrecen el servicio del autobús cuando tengamos el horario de LLEGADA TARDE y un día regular en las escuelas. Los horarios también se pueden encontrar en la pestaña PARENT / GUARDIAN de nuestro Distrito 105 y los sitios web de las escuelas.

Por favor asegúrese que la seguridad de nuestros estudiantes es lo que más me importa cuando tomo una decisión con los superintendentes del municipio sobre la cancelación de la escuela. Debido a que las circunstancias individuales varían, es importante reconocer que nuestros padres tienen el derecho y la responsabilidad primordiales de determinar si envían o no a sus hijos a la escuela durante situaciones de clima de emergencia.

District 105 Preschool Screening

Friday, January 19, 2018

School District #105 will be conducting preschool screening for **three to five year old children** residing in the district. The screening team will assess each child's development to determine who might benefit from special services prior to Kindergarten. The following skill areas will be assessed:

1. Concepts-body parts, colors, rapid object naming, rote counting(counting forward, counting backward, number identification), meaningful counting(counting blocks, number relationships), shapes(identifying shapes, sorting shapes, sorting by color and size)
2. Speech and Language-personal information, articulation, identifying objects and actions (expressively and receptively), letters and sounds(alphabet song, letter naming, letter-sound correspondence), problem-solving
3. Vision and Hearing

Screening will take place **Friday, January 19th between 8:30 AM and 12:45 PM at Hodgkins Park District, 8997 Lyons St, Hodgkins** for all district children. The entire screening will take about 60 minutes.

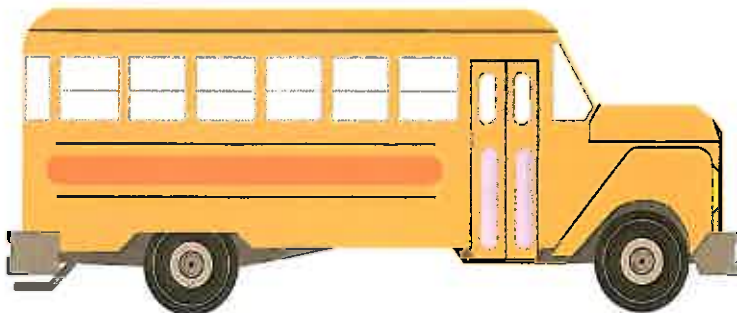

5. Examen de Ojos y Oídos

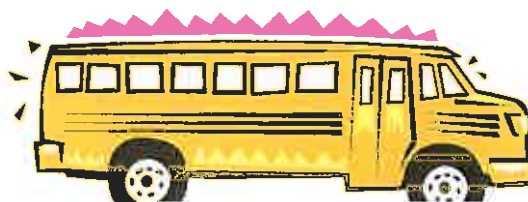

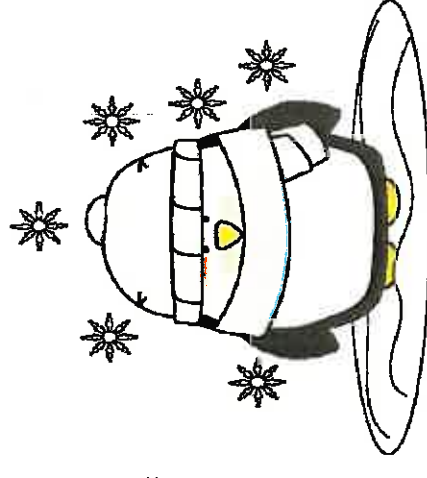

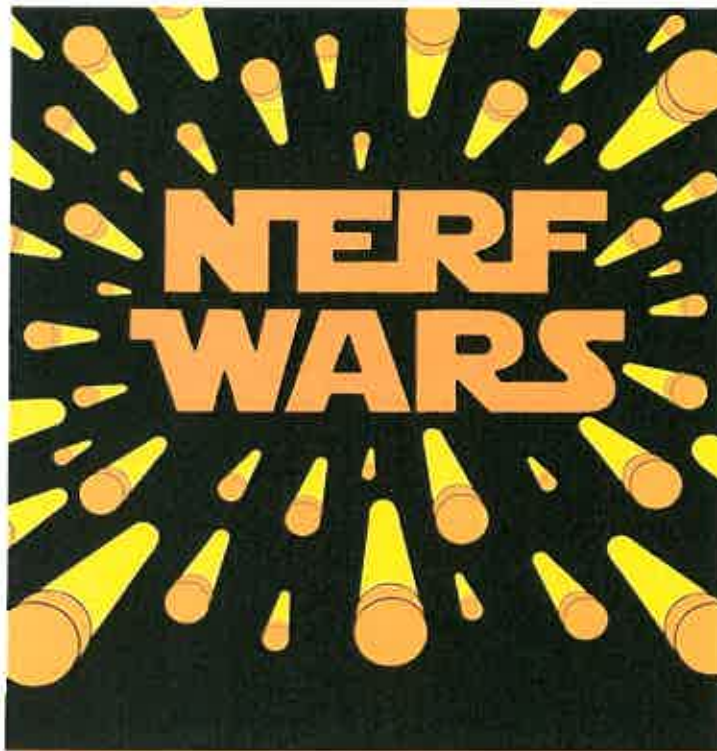
