Happy Holidays to all of our families! This is the second of six **District 105 Newsletters** we will send throughout the year. This one-page newsletter is another way we highlight the important district information we share on our website and through social media, presentations, and forums.

Did You Know?

- We are very proud that the members of our staff, administration, and School Board are frequently recruited to make regional and national presentations about our best practices in School District 105:
 - Spring Avenue LLC Director Joanna Marek recently presented "Primary Source Pairings with Award-Winning Books" at the National American Association of School Librarians Conference.
 - Kathryn Heeke, Director of Curriculum and Instruction, and Kindergarten Teachers, Mary Pat Larocca, Celine Hill, and Joy Conrady will present "Teacher Agency: Building a Culture for Professional Learning" at the National Learning Forward Conference.
 - Eighth Grade Math Teacher Susan Calder will present "Using Technology for Math Formative Assessments," and District Math Specialist Kathleen Courtney will present, "Geometry, Measurement, and Games for the Classroom" at the Metropolitan Math Club of Chicago Conference.
 - School Board President Dave Herndon and Superintendent Glenn Schlichting will make a presentation entitled "Ensuring a Return on Your Strategic Plan Investment" at the Illinois Conference of School Board Members, Business Officials, and Administrators.

PARCC (Presentation of PARCC results posted under School Board tab of district website)

Although our students performed better than 90% of students in suburban school districts with similar student demographics, our overall results and trends are lower than we expect. Our district has not placed an emphasis on PARCC because we have not been able to use the results for continuous improvement in the same way we use other indicators of our district and school success. PARCC results are not returned to the district for sixth months – a lag that makes it impossible to use assessment information to capture student growth and adapt to students' learning needs. For that reason, we have placed greater confidence in these measures of student performance:

- **High School Placement:** We closely monitor the level of courses for which our Gurrie students qualify at LT. The percentage of our students from last year's Gurrie graduating class scheduled into advanced and honors courses at LT was the second highest among any graduating class since we began tracking this data in 2003:
 - Honors/Accelerated English: Class of 2017 (56%); Class of 2003 (33%)
 - Honors/Accelerated Math: Class of 2017 (55%); Class of 2003 (27%)
 - Honors/Accelerated Science: Class of 2017 (42%); Class of 2003 (34%)
- **High School Persistence/Success:** We monitor how our former students perform in their scheduled LT classes. Last year, the percentage of former District 105 students earning A's or B's in accelerated and honors classes at LT was the highest of any year since we began tracking this data ten years ago.
- **High School Freshmen Surveys:** In a 2016-17 survey administered to LT freshmen, our former students rated their middle school experience and preparation for LT higher than the collective average of the other township middle schools.
- **Five Essentials/District Surveys:** Our students gave the district very high ratings in all areas, including the quality of instruction, student learning opportunities and support, and school climate.
- **Measures of Academic Progress (MAP):** Students performed at historically high levels on the 2016-17 MAP test. The district ranked at approximately the 90th percentile nationally for student spring-to-spring progress in math and reading. The district ranked above the 80th percentile nationally for math and reading achievement. MAP results are available to us on the same day the assessment is administered, which allows us to use the results to set goals with students and adapt instruction to their needs. MAP is the test used by LT for freshmen course scheduling.

Our success in so many areas in the 2016-17 school year does not minimize our desire for our students to perform their best on all assessments, including PARCC. We are improving PARCC testing schedules, routines, and communication to help our students show their best learning on this assessment. At the same time, we are being careful not to sacrifice the depth and rigor of our regular classroom instruction for short-term test preparation.

- Estamos muy orgullosos de que los miembros de nuestro personal, la administración y la Junta Escolar sean reclutados con frecuencia para hacer presentaciones regionales y nacionales sobre las mejores prácticas en el Distrito Escolar 105:

- o La directora del LLC en Spring Avenue, Joanna Marek, recientemente presentó "Emparejamientos de Fuentes Primarias con Libros Ganadores de Premios" en la Conferencia de la Asociación Nacional de Bibliotecas Escolares de los Estados Unidos.

- o Kathryn Heeke, Directora de Currículo e Instrucción, y Maestras de Kindergarten, Mary Pat Larocca, Celine Hill, y Joy Conrady presentarán "Agencia de Maestros: Construyendo una Cultura para el Aprendizaje Profesional" en la Conferencia Nacional de Aprendizaje Adelante.

- o La maestra de Matemáticas de Octavo Grado Susan Calder presentará "Uso de Tecnología para Evaluaciones Formativas de Matemáticas", y la Especialista de Matemáticas del Distrito Kathleen Courtney presentará, "Geometría, Medición y Juegos para el Salón de Clase" en la Conferencia Club Metropolitano de Matemáticas de Chicago.

PARCC (Presentación de los resultados de PARCC publicados en la pestaña de la Junta Escolar del sitio web del distrito)

Aunque nuestros estudiantes obtuvieron mejores resultados que el 90% de los estudiantes en los distritos escolares suburbanos con datos demográficos similares, nuestros resultados y tendencias generales están más bajos de lo que esperamos. Nuestro distrito no le ha puesto énfasis a PARCC porque no hemos podido utilizar los resultados para la mejora continua de la misma manera que usamos otros indicadores de nuestro distrito y el éxito escolar. Los resultados de PARCC no son regresados al distrito por seis meses, un retraso que imposibilita el uso de la información de evaluación para capturar el crecimiento del estudiante y adaptarse a las necesidades de aprendizaje de los estudiantes. Por esa razón, hemos confiado más en estas medidas de rendimiento estudiantil:

- **Colocación En La Escuela Secundaria:** supervisamos el nivel de los cursos que los estudiantes de Gurrie califican en LT. El porcentaje de los estudiantes que se graduaron el año pasado de Gurrie y se registraron para cursos avanzados y de honores en LT fue el segundo más alto entre todas las clases que se han graduado desde que comenzamos a recolectar estos datos en 2003:

- o Honores / Inglés Acelerado: Clase de 2017 (56%); Clase de 2003 (33%)

- o Honores / Matemáticas Aceleradas: Clase de 2017 (55%); Clase de 2003 (27%)

- o Honores / Ciencias Aceleradas: Clase de 2017 (42%); Clase de 2003 (34%)

- **Persistencia/Éxito En La Escuela Secundaria:** supervisamos como les van a nuestros ex alumnos en sus clases de LT. El año pasado, el porcentaje de los estudiantes de D105 que obtuvieron A's o B en clases aceleradas y de honores en LT fueron los más altos de cualquier año desde que comenzamos a recolectar estos datos hace diez años.

- **Encuestas De Estudiantes De Primer Año En La Escuela Secundaria:** En una encuesta de 2016-17 administrada a estudiantes de primer año en LT, nuestros ex alumnos calificaron su experiencia de la escuela intermedia y preparación para LT superior al promedio colectivo de las otras escuelas intermedias del municipio.

- **Cinco Esenciales / Encuestas del Distrito:** nuestros alumnos le dieron calificaciones muy altas al distrito en todas las áreas, incluyendo calidad de instrucción, las oportunidades de aprendizaje y el apoyo de los alumnos y el clima escolar.

- **Medidas de Progreso Académico (MAP):** los estudiantes se desempeñaron a niveles históricamente altos en el examen MAP 2016-17. El distrito clasifico aproximadamente en el 90% a nivel nacional para el progreso de los estudiantes de primavera a primavera en matemáticas y lectura. El distrito clasifico por encima del 80% a nivel nacional en logros de matemáticas y lectura. Los resultados de MAP están disponibles para nosotros el mismo día en que se administra la evaluación, lo que nos permite usar los resultados para establecer metas con los alumnos y adaptar la instrucción a sus necesidades. MAP es la prueba utilizada por LT para la programación de cursos de primer año.

Nuestro éxito en muchas áreas en el año escolar 2016-17 no minimiza nuestro deseo de que nuestros alumnos hagan lo mejor en todas las evaluaciones, incluyendo PARCC. Estamos mejorando los horarios, las rutinas y la comunicación de los exámenes PARCC para ayudarles a nuestros alumnos a mostrar su mejor aprendizaje en esta evaluación. Al mismo tiempo, tenemos cuidado de no sacrificar la profundidad y el rigor de nuestra instrucción regular en el salón de clase para la preparación de exámenes de corta duración.
