## Holiday Care Package Community Service Opportunity 12.10.18

Greetings District 105 families,

On Monday, December 10<sup>th</sup>, District 105 will be coordinating a unique community service opportunity for 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Graders. The project will entail sorting and assembly of boxes of items for families in need at the D105 Care Closet, which is housed at 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue School.

Interested 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Graders will be bused from their home schools at approximately 2:45 to 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue. There, they will work on the items and boxes for one hour, supervised by D105 staff. Students will be able to interact with students from their own schools AND students from the other three elementary schools as they work on the boxes. ### Head Lice Information for Everyone

#### What is Head Lice?

- Head lice are small bugs that live on the human head. They are oval-shaped, like tiny footballs. They have six legs and are either light gray or dark in color.
- They cannot jump, fly, or travel long distances (for example, they couldn't crawl from the floor to someone's head). They also do not infest pets.
- Head lice are almost as common as the common cold in children. **ANY child can get head lice.** It doesn't matter where children live, where they go to school, what color their skin is, or how clean their hair or house is.
- **Lice are not considered a medical or public health problem as they are not believed to cause any disease.**
- Expect/assume that there are always people infested with head lice wherever there are human heads. Head lice is more common in children as they tend to be less protective of their personal space and more frequently have the close head to head contact needed to transfer lice.

#### How Does a Person Get Head Lice?

- Most often through close head to head contact with a person who has head lice.
- Less often through sharing of combs, brushes, hats, or bedding that has had recent contact with a person with head lice.

Remember: Head lice do not jump, fly, or travel long distances. They also do not live for very long off of the human head. Eggs (nits) that may have fallen from the head are not able to hatch off of the head. They need contact with a human head almost immediately to survive.

#### How Can We Prevent Head Lice?

##### Teach and re-teach these to children:

- Avoid close head to head contact.
- Do not share combs, brushes, hair ornaments, hats, scarves, pillows, and other items that contact the head.

#### How Would I Know If My Child Has Head Lice?

- **Check Your Student's Head Regularly. We strongly recommend doing this every week.**
- Look at the hair and scalp. Start above and behind ears and at the bottom of the hair at the neck. Live lice may crawl and move away from light. Also look for nits (eggs). These are oval shaped and usually look yellowish white and may be shiny. They are hard to remove from the hair. Dandruff and hair products are often mistaken for nits, but these are very easy to remove from the hair, where nits are not.
- Itching is usually the only sign of head lice.

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### What should I do if I find head lice?

#### DO:

- Check all family members and close contacts.
- Treat persons who have live lice and/or nits/eggs that are very close to the scalp (within 1/4 inch from the scalp).
- Clean personal items and vacuum items that have been in contact with the infested person's head in the past 1-2 days before treatment. Wash items in hot water and dry them in the hot dryer cycle. Furniture, carpeting, or items that cannot be washed can be vacuumed.
- Notify your child's school nurse of your findings. The nurse will need to check your child's head when he/she returns to school and may also like to check his/her close contacts. Nurses also monitor for clusters of head lice.

#### DON'T:

- Spend a great amount of energy trying to find out where and who the lice came from. It is most important to focus time and energy on checking heads of all family members and close contacts and treating infested people appropriately. Many times a case of head lice creates fear and anger that is far greater than the actual health threat this represents. This unfortunately leads to teasing, anger, and lost days of school.

The school nurses are available to confirm findings and answer any questions you may have.

### When should a person be treated for head lice?

- **Only when there is an active infestation (live bugs or eggs/nits very close to the scalp).** There are many treatment options available. Some treatments are available over the counter at pharmacies/drugstores. Others are available with a prescription from a doctor. Follow the package instructions very closely. Some treatments need a second application about 10 days from the first. After treatment, you can remove lice and nits from the head by using the comb included with the treatment and/or by hand
- **Treatments do not prevent people from getting head lice and should not be used unless the person has live lice or eggs/nits very close to the scalp. They can be harmful if overused and can cause lice to become resistant to the treatments. Household sprays or insecticides are not recommended. They have not been shown to be effective and expose people to chemicals that could be harmful. Vacuuming is the safest and best way to remove lice and nits from furniture, rugs, car seats, and stuffed animals.**

### How should a household be cleaned if a person in it is found to have lice?

- Wash bedding (sheets, pillowcases), nightclothes, car seat covers, towels, stuffed animals, and any other personal items that had close contact with the infested person's head in the past couple of days. These should be washed in hot water and dried in the hot dryer cycle for at least 30 minutes.
- Items that cannot be washed can be vacuumed or placed in tightly closed plastic or garbage bags for two weeks.
- Combs, brushes, hats, hair accessories that have come in contact with the person with lice can be cleaned in hot water.
- Vacuum bare mattresses, carpet, stuffed animals, couches, and any other surfaces that may have had contact with the person's head in the past couple of days.

**Información General acerca de Piojos de la cabeza**

**¿Que son los piojos de la cabeza?**

- Son pequeños animales que viven en la cabeza de los humanos. Tienen forma ovalada, como de pequeños fútbols. Tienen 6 patas y son de color gris claro u oscuro.
- No pueden saltar, volar, o recorrer distancias largas (por ejemplo, no podrían arrastrarse del suelo a la cabeza de una persona). Tampoco invaden a las mascotas.
- Los piojos de cabeza son casi tan comunes como los refriados en los niños. **Cualquier niño puede contagiarse de piojos.** No importa donde vive, a que escuela va, el color de la piel, o que tan limpio mantiene su cabello o su casa.
- **Los piojos no son considerados un problema médico o de salud pública ya que no se considera que causen ninguna infección.**
- Espere/asuma que siempre habrá gente con piojos en donde hallan cabezas humanas. Los piojos son más comúnmente en los niños, ya que ellos tienden a proteger menos su espacio personal y tienen contacto más frecuente de cabeza a cabeza y así es como se transfieren los piojos.

**¿Cómo se contagia una persona con piojos de cabeza?**

- La mayoría de las veces con contactos cercanos de cabeza a cabeza, con una persona que tiene piojos de cabeza.
- Menos común es el contagio, compartiendo peinillas, cepillos, gorras, o con la ropa de cama que ha tenido contacto reciente con alguien con piojos de cabeza.

Recuerde: Los piojos de cabeza no pueden saltar, volar, o recorrer distancias largas. Tampoco viven largo tiempo por fuera de la cabeza de una persona. Los huevos (liendres) que se caigan de la cabeza de una persona, no pueden madurar. Necesitan del contacto con la cabeza de una persona casi que de inmediato para poder sobrevivir.

**¿Cómo se pueden prevenir los Piojos de Cabeza?**

**Enseñe y continúeles enseñando esto a los niños:**

- Evite los contactos cercanos de cabeza con cabeza.
- No comparta peinillas, cepillos, adornos del pelo, gorras, bufandas, almohadas, u otras cosas que tengan contacto con la cabeza.

**¿Cómo se si mi niño tiene Piojos de Cabeza?**

- **Revise la cabeza de su estudiante regularmente. Recomendamos fuertemente que esto se haga semanalmente.**
- Observe su cabello y cuero cabelludo. Empiece encima y detrás de las orejas y alrededor del cuello. Los piojos vivos se mueven y arrastran lejos de la luz. También busque por liendres (huevos). Estos son de forma ovalada y tienen un color blanco amarillento y pueden ser brillantes. Son difíciles de quitar del pelo. La caspa y algunos productos para el cabello a menudo se confunden con piojos, pero estos se pueden quitar fácilmente del cabello, a diferencia de las liendres.
- La comezón es normalmente el único síntoma de los piojos.

### **¿Qué debo hacer si encuentro piojos de cabeza?**

#### **HAGA:**

- Revise a todos los miembros de la familia y a contactos cercanos.
- Ponga en tratamiento a las personas que tengan piojos vivos o liendres/huevos, que pueden encontrarse a más o menos 1/4 de pulgada del cuero cabelludo.
- Limpie los elementos de cuidado personal y aspire las cosas que hayan estado en contacto con la cabeza de la persona infestada en los 2 últimos días antes del tratamiento. Limpie las cosas lavables en agua caliente y séquelas en ciclo caliente. Muebles, alfombras, o cosas que no pueden ser lavadas, pueden ser aspiradas.
- Notifique a la oficina de enfermería de la escuela lo que haya encontrado. La enfermera tendrá que revisar la cabeza del estudiante al regresar a la escuela y puede que quiera revisar también a sus contactos cercanos. Las enfermeras también revisan por grupos de piojos de cabeza.

#### **NO HAGA:**

- Gaste mucho de su tiempo o energía tratando de encontrar de donde vino el contagio. Es más importante concentrarse en revisar las cabezas de los miembros de la familia y de los contactos cercanos, al igual que obtener el tratamiento adecuado.
- En muchas oportunidades un caso de piojos de cabeza crea angustias y disgustos que son mayores a la amenaza de salud que pueden representar. Infortunadamente esto conlleva a burlas, disgustos, y pérdidas de días de escuela.

Las enfermeras de la escuela están disponibles para confirmar lo que haya encontrado y para contestar cualquier pregunta que usted pueda tener con este respecto.

### **¿Cuándo se debe poner en tratamiento a una persona con piojos de cabeza?**

- **Únicamente cuando hay una infestación activa (bichos vivos o huevos/liendres cerca del cuero cabelludo).** Hay muchas opciones de tratamiento disponibles. Algunos tratamientos están disponibles sin receta media en las farmacias. Otros requieren de una prescripción médica. Siga las instrucciones en el paquete de cerca. Algunos tratamientos requieren de una segunda aplicación aproximadamente 10 días después de la primera. Después del tratamiento, los piojos y las liendres se pueden sacar de la cabeza usando una peinilla incluida en el tratamiento y/o a mano.
- **El tratamiento no previene los piojos de cabeza en las personas, y no deben ser usados a no ser que la persona tenga piojos vivos o huevos/liendres cerca del cuero cabelludo. Estos tratamientos pueden ser perjudiciales para la salud si se usan demasiado y pueden hacer que los piojos se vuelvan resistentes al tratamiento. No se recomienda el uso de aerosoles o insecticidas para el hogar. No se ha demostrado su efectividad para este propósito y exponer a las personas a sus químicos puede ser perjudicial para la salud. Aspirar es la forma mejor y más segura para remover piojos y liendres de muebles, alfombras, asientos de carro, y animales de peluche.**

### **¿Cómo se debe limpiar una casa si se encuentra que uno de sus miembros tiene piojos?**

- Lave la ropa de cama (sábanas, fundas de almohadas), ropa de noche, cobertores de asientos de carro, toallas, peluches, y cualquier otra cosa de uso personal que haya tenido contacto con la cabeza de la persona infestada en los últimos días. Estos deben ser lavados en agua caliente y secados en ciclo caliente por lo menos por 30 minutos.
- Los artículos que no pueden ser lavados pueden ser aspirados o meterse en bolsas plásticas o de la basura bien cerradas por dos semanas.
- Peinillas, cepillos, gorras, artículos para el cabello que han tenido contacto con la persona con piojos pueden ser limpiados con agua caliente.
- Aspire los colchones, alfombra, animales de peluche, sofás, y cualquier otra superficie que pudo haber tenido contacto con la cabeza de la persona con piojos de cabeza.

Favor llamar a la enfermera de la escuela si tiene cualquier otra pregunta o si le gustaría tener información adicional.

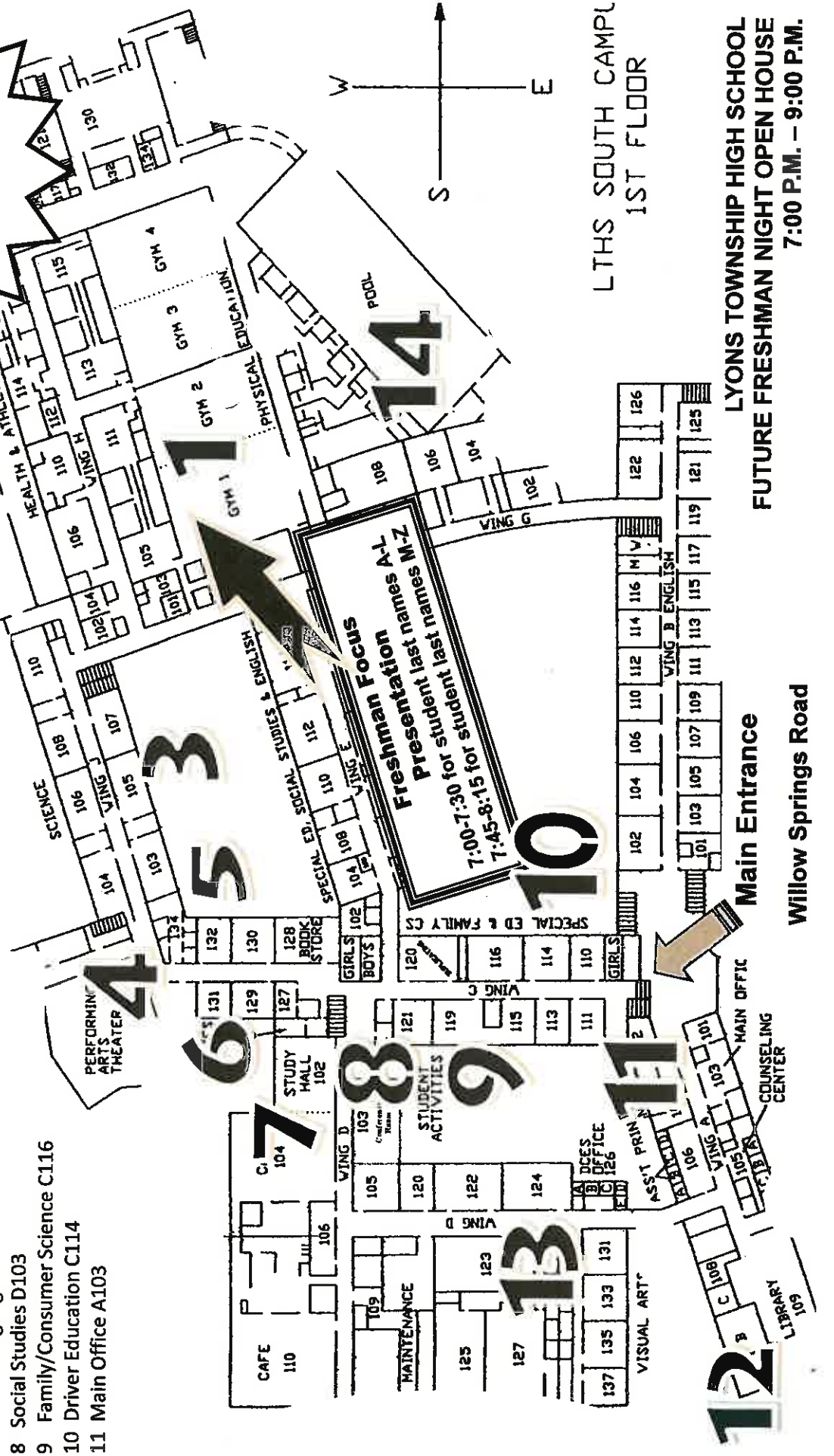

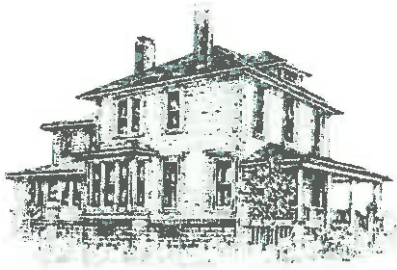
