Storytime introduces children to early literacy skills as well as the library through a half hour of stories, activities, and songs. Parents also have the opportunity to learn new stories and songs with their children and meet other parents. The toddler storytimes planned for ages 2 and 3 have shorter stories and more movement. If your child is ready for longer stories, then they are ready to move on to our preschool storytimes for 3-5 year olds. Parents and caregivers can choose which storytime is appropriate for their 3-year-old. Registration is required.

To do our part, 7th graders will participate in a service project to help restore the environment. This restoration project is one way students can volunteer their time and make a difference. Please read the details below that summarizes the **IMPORTANT INFORMATION**.

WHEN: Tuesday, Sept. 17th

Each group will be gone for about 2 hours. Students will be divided into 3 groups based on their Advisory. Your child will be told when they are going on the trip during MP.

WHERE: Sagawau Environmental Learning Center at 12545 West 111th St, Lemont, IL 60439

PURPOSE: To remove invasive species from local forest preserves. On this trip we are removing the invasive plants, Buckthorn and Honeysuckle.

Lunch: Students will not be at school during the regular lunch time. Each student needs to bring a lunch, including something to drink.

HOW TO DRESS: Please dress appropriately for the weather and for working outside. Although the weather may still be warm, layers work best. We will be outside in the forest preserve for this activity. Regardless of the temperature, pants, socks, and gym shoes or boots must be worn. If possible, students may want to bring a pair of working gloves.

WEATHER: The trip may be canceled due to severe weather.

IMPORTANT: Students will not be allowed to participate in this service project if they do not come dressed appropriately for the activity. See the above guidelines or call your child's advisor if you have any questions.

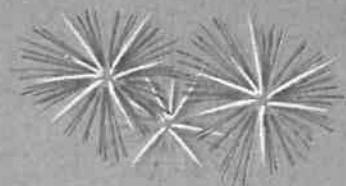

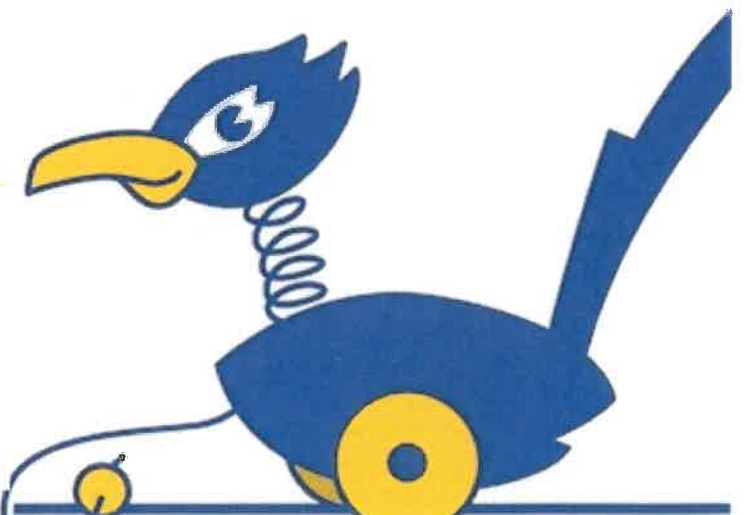
