Kindergarten Philosophy:

We tell the children that they **CAN** read!!
(Environmental print!!)



- That the children will **secure their number sense** and be ready for math activities in the rest of their "school career."

- *Responsive Classroom* is an approach to teaching based on the belief that integrating academic and social-emotional skills creates an environment where students can do their best learning.
- Positive teacher language, interactive modeling, and investing students in rules through Hopes and Dreams

Phonics and Phonemic Awareness

- Letter Names
- Letter Sounds
- Poems and Songs
- Rhyming
- **Oral word work** (orally segment, blend, delete, and add sounds. For example: bat without the b is at.)

- Listening and speaking
- Independent reading
- Leveled books
- Writing
- Asking/answering questions about stories
- Handwriting

- 2D/3D shapes
- Addition and subtraction within 5
- Oral counting by 1's and 10's to 100
- Number Identification 0-20
- One-one correspondence (up to 20 objects)
- Writing numbers 1-20
- Positional language
- (Qualitative concepts)

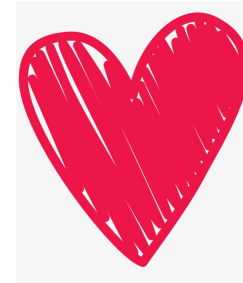
