FRESHMAN ELECTIVE COURSE REQUEST WORKSHEET

WELCOME CLASS OF 2028! An important part of your transition to LTHS is putting together your freshman schedule. Please use this worksheet to help you plan and visualize what your school day might look like next year. We won't know specific details about which class you will have during which period or who your teacher will be yet, but you will receive that information in August before school starts.

Here is some important information to know before making your class choices:

- Every student has 8 periods in their day – 7 class periods and 1 Lunch/ Study Hall period. Your Lunch/ Study Hall will either be during your 4th or 5th period (middle of the day).
- All of the freshman required classes are year-long (Annual) courses while many of the electives are only semester-long. There are some year-long electives such as World language courses, however.
- Freshmen typically have space in their schedule to choose 1-2 electives for each semester.
- Most of the freshman year classes are required but as you move into sophomore, junior, and senior year, you will have much more room in your schedule to take electives.
- Use the Academic Program Guide, the course selection sheet, and the Class of 2028 website to learn about our elective courses to inform your choices. Once choices have been made and course requests entered, school policy does not allow for course changes.
- Placement for your English, Math, and Science courses will be sent to you on January 25th and those courses will be automatically placed into your schedule along with your Social Studies course (World History or AP Human Geography) and PE, which are requirements. More information about placement will be shared with you and your families in the placement letter.
