## Why PARCC Scores Look Different than ISAT

More rigorous expectations focused on the skills students need in today's world, including critical thinking, problem solving, and reasoning.

PARCC tests are measuring complex skills, different from previous state tests, thus it is expected that scores on the PARCC test will look lower.

The test measures performance against a higher set of standards.

- That doesn't mean they aren't doing as well - it just means the expectations are higher.

The tests measure skills students need in the real world.

## Why PARCC Scores Look Different than ISAT

There is an opportunity to make sure students are ready for the next step.

- The new tests provide accurate information about how students are performing against the new standards
- teachers, parents and students can work together to ensure kids are prepared for success

No state is alone.
Student scores will improve.
Students are just as smart, but the bar has been raised.
In the first year, PARCC scores set a new baseline.

## PARCC 2016

- Testing Window 2016 - April 4-28
- Must land between, approximately, the 75\% mark of school year to $90 \%$ mark of school year
- Consolidated two testing windows into one
- Reduced total test time for most students by 90 minutes
- Consists of six or seven test units, compared to the eight or nine sessions in 2015.
- Reduced the math testing time by 60 minutes
- Removed 30 minutes from the English Language Arts portion for most students.
