

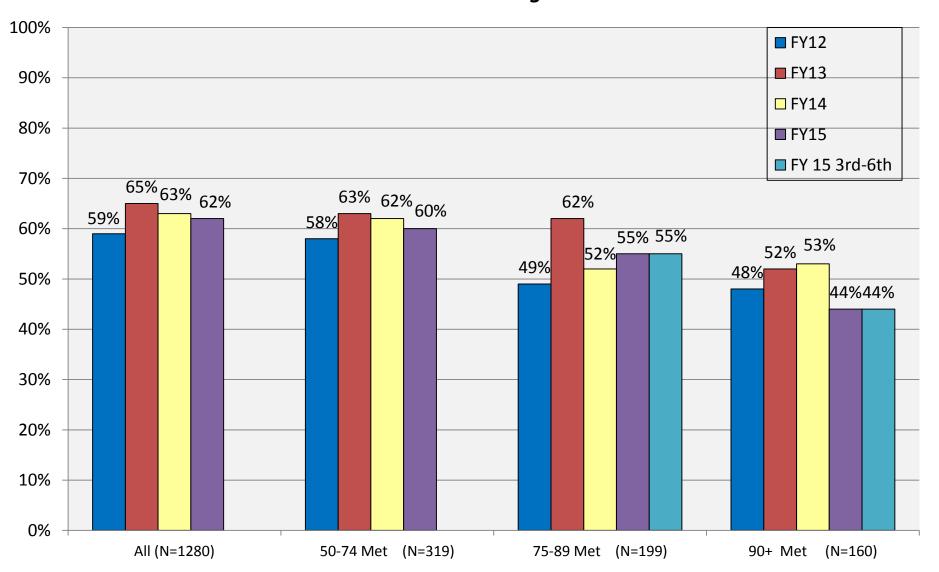

District 105 <u>Reading Progress</u> Fall-Spring FY14 Percentage of Students Meeting Annual Progress Target in Each Percentile Range



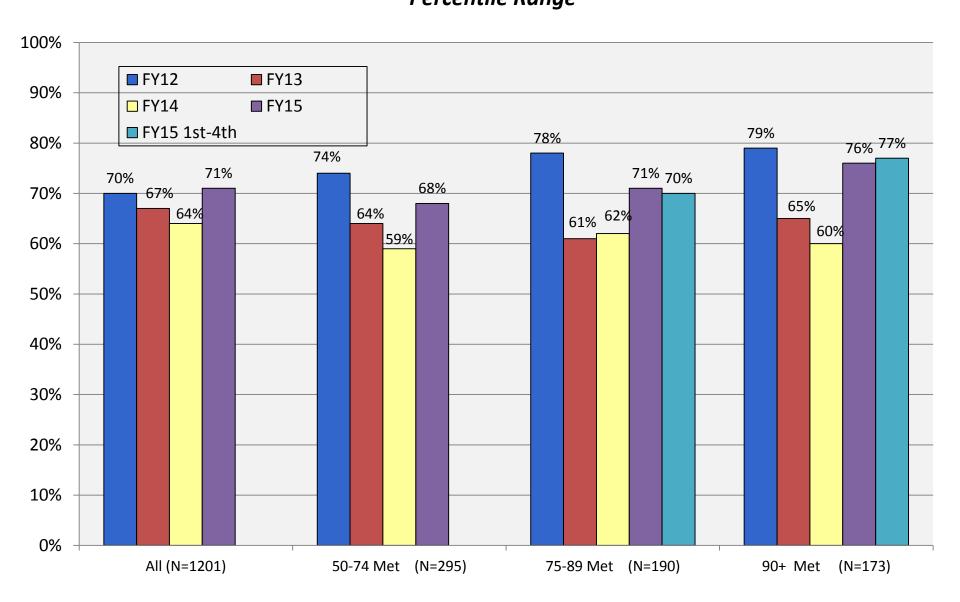
Percentage of Students Meeting Annual Progress Target in Each Percentile Range






District 4th Grade Cohort - Percentage of students at or above 50th percentile n=128




4th Grade Low Income (54) and Hispanic (43) Cohorts – Percentage at or above the 50th percentile on spring MAP.




District 5th Grade Cohort - Percentage of students at or above 50th percentile n=128




5th Grade Low Income (56) and Hispanic (41) Cohorts – Percentage at or above the 50th percentile on spring MAP.




District 6th Grade Cohort Percentage of students at or above 50th percentile n=122




6th Grade Low Income (48) and Hispanic (44) Cohorts – Percentage at or above the 50th percentile on spring MAP.




District 7th Grade Cohort – Percentage of students at or above the 50th percentile on spring MAP. N=118
